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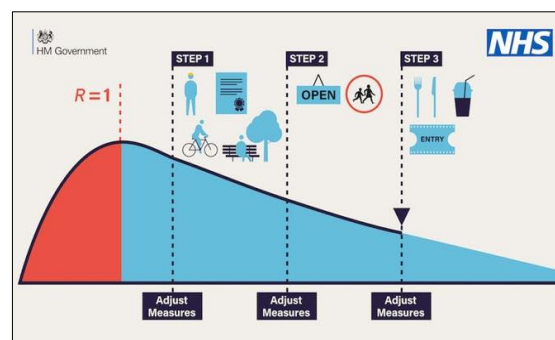

Dear parents/carers,

I hope you and your loved ones are all safe and well. I also hope you are getting used to the adjustments made by the Government under step 1 of the roadmap to end the UK lockdown.

Firstly, I would like to thank families for their patience and understanding. I am sure you were keen to hear details of our re-opening plans sooner, but the time afforded to school staff last week was invaluable. It gave us the space we needed to familiarise ourselves with the Government's guidance and consult with colleagues to ensure our approach adheres to all the new protection and control measures, relative to both the human and physical resources we have available.



Phased re-opening from 1st June – Information Booklet

To share our plans for 1st June onward, we have produced a separate booklet. Although it is quite lengthy, I would ask all of you to read it very carefully, including the parents/carers of children in Years 2/3/4/5, even though these year groups are not set to return on 1st June. Moreover, it is also important that any parents/carers with children in Years R/1/6 who may be considering not sending their child(ren) back to school in Term 6 read the booklet thoroughly as well.

NB. Please be aware that our plans are subject to change and it is very important that parents/carers make employers aware of this fact if they will be relying on the school to enable them to return to work. The Government's decision to re-open schools from 1st June is conditional on the scientific advice they take nearer the proposed re-opening date (I believe the final decision will be taken towards the end of the half term week). Also, there could be changes that we need to make to our plan following further guidance from the DfE – the Department's advice is being updated at very regular intervals which we are doing our very best to keep up with. In addition, our plans are subject to our own staffing availability now and in the near future. Therefore, while the plans outlined in the Information Booklet are correct at the time of writing, it is possible things might change.

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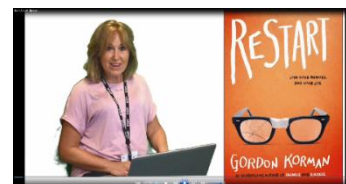

Therefore, we will provide a 'Holiday Activity Pack' (similar to the one published for Easter), containing lots of fun and exciting challenges and tasks for you to make use of at your leisure should you wish to – more details to follow at the end of the week.
