Numeracy Targets

To help your child to read and show o'clock and half past times confidently on a clock, try letting them play on the games below.

Writing Targets

To help your child to learn how to spell many Year 1 common exception words correctly, try getting them to practise spelling words from the sheet provided or play the game below.

Please use the attached 'Year 1 Common Exception Words' sheet to encourage your child to regularly practise spelling these tricky words.
